
R/C hr PYLON Club Rules

OPEN GLIDER Club Rules

Any FF glider is suitable. Contestant must own the model, but does not have to be its builder. Points scored at the rate of one per second over three flights, each of which can earn a maximum of 180 points. Flights under 20 seconds are not recorded. Gliders are towed into the air with a line that does not exceed 50 metres when pulled tight.



LOGO / MOTTO



ALTERNATIVE FLYING SITES

Members are reminded that insurance cover, either through NZMAA or HBRF, is applicable only to approved sites.

To obtain approval for a site, simply inform the Secretary of its location, and the area will be registered as a flying site that qualifies for insurance cover.

Covering yourself in this way costs you nothing extra - insurance costs have been built into Club fees.

CONTEST DIRECTORS

It is intended to tidy up this perennial problem by developing a list of willing CDs for each Club contest. This would relieve those 'Old Faithfuls' who usually end up with CD duties simply because they have done it before.

It is not necessary to have vast experience in a modelling area in order to act as CD for that contest at our Club level. Every member will shortly be receiving a booklet containing, amongst other things, the rules of all Club contests. Using these rules it would be possible for a non-modeller to act as an efficient CD, so there is no reason why any HBRF member could not do the same. If each member volunteers for just ONE event, the load can be spread so thin that you will only be called upon about once every 3 YEARS.

HBRF THERMAL INVITATIONAL : EASTER 1987

A lot of effort was put into our first nationally advertised thermal event. The advertising paid off as ten competitors from outside our region attended. Wanganui, Rotorua, Wellington, and Palmerston North clubs were represented, as well as ten fliers from HBRF.

Holding the event over the four day Easter week-end allowed time for travel. Saturday was cool at about 17°, with high cloud and light NE breezes. Thermals were very narrow banded and skill was needed to stay within them.

Two rounds of Thermal A were flown prior to lunch with two rounds following the break. Before lunch Keith Elliott of WMAC scored well in round one, leading Graham Main and Harvey Stiver by a narrow margin. The next two rounds resulted in some of the highest scores that I have seen recorded: over 15 fliers scoring more than 400 points each. The thermals were really active!

Harvey Stiver was a clear leader after the 3rd round, having dropped only 24 points from a possible 920. Round 4 was warmer, and with fliers getting to know where the thermals were likely to be, 10 out of 20 scored above 400 points.

Placings did not change in the 4th round, with the leader, Harvey Stiver (who also acted as CD), improving on his Rd.1 score by scoring 1321 out of a possible 1380. Keith Elliot (WMAC) was second with 1278, Peter Brown (WMAC) was third equal with Graham Main, their scores being 1257.

To finish the day, a fly-off by all competitors who scored over 1200 points was held, with a Le Mans start, open flight time, landing in pit area. The placings for this were: H.Stiver 6:21, 2nd P.Brown 5:51, 3rd K.Elliot 4:41, 4th D.Ansell 4:24, 5th G.Main 4:01. Altogether, a great day was had by all.

Sunday was cold with drizzle and thermals shaped like drinking straws. Staying in a thermal needed a bit of luck. Thermal B is a 10min max contest with 100 points available as a landing bonus. Three rounds were flown, and all rounds counted. Harvey Stiver flew the last round from within the

CD's tent, while Keith Elliot braved the steady rain. Barry Roberts did not fly because of the risk of the tower slipping in the wet conditions. Top flight score went to Keith Flliot - 13min 20sec.


Three fliers scored maximum points. Keith Elliot, Peter Brown, and Harvey Stiver flew off in Le Mans style, open flight times, and FAI landing bonus. All models were launched together, with Keith Elliot getting a launch height of perhaps 100ft more than either of the other two fliers. Harvey moved to his favourite site with Peter following and Keith finding his own piece of sky further to the south where he missed out on the thermal activity and soon lost valuable height.

Peter Brown managed the longest flight, to beat Harvey Stiver by 20 points - well done Peter.

The HBRF supplied prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in each of the two events, as well as a Champ of Champs prize which was won by Harvey Stiver. Hastings Model Supplies donated handouts for all contestants: thanks Leicester for a great gesture. Thanks also go to Margaret Sharpe, Pat Stiver, Nora Roberts, Diana Harris and Andrew Stiver for their assistance on the food and drinks stall.

I am sure that the 'Invitational' will become a regular event on the 'Thermal Trail'. Thanks to all visitors - see you next year.
